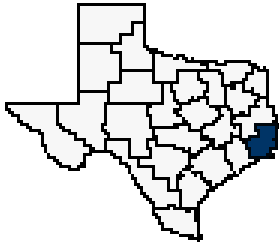




DISTRICT PROFILE

The Beaumont District is responsible for the design, construction and maintenance of more than 2,400 miles of state highway, and more than 1,500 bridges in Southeast Texas. The district covers eight counties and is located along the Gulf Coast and adjacent to Louisiana.

KEY PROJECTS UNDERWAY:

- I-10 – Reconstruct I-10 between Orange and Louisiana state line and widen to six lanes – \$120 million (two separate projects)
- I-10 – Add lanes between SH 73 and Walden Road – \$279 million (three separate projects)
- US 69 – Reconfigure interchange at SH 73 - \$70 million
- US 69 – Add lanes between the northern I-10/US 69 interchange and LNVA Canal - \$33 million
- I-10 – Reconfigure the southern I-10/US 69 interchange - \$307 million
- US 69 – Add lanes from Warren to north of Kountze - \$205 million

PLANNED KEY PROJECTS:

- I-10 – Reconfigure the northern I-10/US 69 interchange – \$450 million
- SH 63 – Replace bridge and approaches at the Sabine River - \$30 million
- US 69 – Add lanes I-10 to SH347 - \$70 million
- SH 105 – Add lanes from Pine Island Bayou to SH 326 - \$85 million
- US 96 – Add lanes from RE 255 to the Sabine County line - \$65 million
- US 69 – Relief route from south of Lumberton to FM 1003 north of Kountze.
- US 69 – Relief Route from south of RR 255 to south of Black Creek.

MAINTENANCE: The district annually spends approximately \$45 million on routine maintenance activities.

CORRIDORS: The district’s major thoroughfares include I-10, I-69/US 59, US 69, US 96, US 190, US 90, SH 105 and SH 99.

SAFETY: Throughout fiscal year 2024, approximately \$70 million will be spent on pavement profile markings, additional paved shoulders, installing overhead signs, safety treating, lighting, traffic signal upgrades, and other safety measures.
